Three New Artists Featured During Fall-Winter Art Exhibit

Rutherford, Calif. – Peju Province Winery welcomes three new artists to be featured in the Peju Art Exhibit beginning Saturday, October 27, 2007. Sculptor, painter and photographer Phillip Dizick, painter Jan Padover and sculptor Tom Schrey will display their artwork in the Peju tasting room tower for viewing and purchasing through Wednesday, January 23, 2008.

In July, 2007 Peju began to showcase top artists from the Bay Area and beyond on a four-month rotating basis. Summer-Fall artists on display included Kat Soto (contemporary doll art), Karala Northey (charcoal drawings) and Gabrielle Curry (sculptor and artist).

Each featured artist is invited to Peju for an entire day to greet guests and fans while speaking about their art collection. Dizick will be available at Peju to meet with the public on Saturday, October 27, Padover on Saturday, December 8 and Schrey on Saturday, January 12, 2008.

When Tony and Herta Peju founded Peju 25 years ago, the couple incorporated their passion for wine, art, architecture and horticulture into the structure, style and hospitality at Peju's Rutherford Estate. The family has committed to surrounding guests with an inventive and artistic experience from the glass, to the tasting room, to the gardens.

"We feel that the winery should be an expression of how we feel about our wines," Tony Peju said about incorporating wine and art. "To make great wine is to take nature's processes to their maximum and create from them a complete aesthetic experience. There is art whether it is in winemaking, sculpting or gardening."

Guests are invited to explore the Peju Art Exhibit at their leisure during the tasting room hours of 10 a.m. to 6 p.m. daily. The notable paintings, sculptures and photographs are all available for purchase.

Peju Province, founded in 1982 by Tony and Herta Peju, is a family-owned boutique winery located in the Rutherford Appellation in the heart of the Napa Valley. Phillip Dizick – Sculptor, Painter, Photographer, Geometrics

Phillip Dizick creates forms expressing mind, body, and soul in three mediums – Sculpture, Paintings and Photography. One of Dizick's major concepts has always been the growth and development of the female. He focuses on female spiritual evolution, capturing the essence of her being, her personal development and growth, self-awareness, love, and empowerment. Through movement in landscape, Dizick depicts the close relationship between Mother Nature and the human female. He cast his work at the prestigious Artworks Foundry in Berkeley, California, where he gained an intimate knowledge of the old-world lost wax-casting method that has strengthened his visions when creating bronze. Whether making custom hardware, wall fountains or door knockers, Schrey enjoys marrying form with function in an innovative manner. Schrey's lifelong love for nature inspires his work. Schrey enjoys creating commission projects, which allow him to collaborate with clients who have an interest in creating unique, distinctive bronze sculptures for their garden or home.
