TASTING

This 2017 PEJU Cabernet Sauvignon is a vibrant represtation of a Napa Valley Cabernet Sauvignon. After aging 18 months in French and American oak, this wine opens with notes of tobacco, clove, and leather. Ripe plum and back cherry lead to a gripping juicy palate. Black fruit compote is expressed as the tannins showcase depth and power. As this wine opens soft hints of Herbs de Provence being to show. This Cabernet Sauvignon dazzles and pairs well alongside many culinary treats, and is cellar worthy for the next 8-10 years.
